**Sensitive receptors* refer to segments of the population most susceptible to poor air quality (i.e. children, elderly and the sick) and to certain at-risk sensitive land uses such as schools, hospitals, parks, or residential communities. Air quality management agencies encourage protection of sensitive receptors by planting trees that remove pollutants from the air and provide shade thereby decreasing the negative impacts of detrimental air quality conditions.
